

Korean Actor-Playwright Youlim Nam's Play "Just a Yellow Cab in New York City" Set to Premiere at Chain Theatre

Korean actor and playwright Youlim Nam will debut her one-act play "Just a Yellow Cab in New York City" at the 2025 Chain Theatre Winter One-Act Festival, beginning February 8 at Manhattan's Chain Theatre.

The play, written and performed by Nam, is directed by Cady McClain, a three-time Emmy Award-winning actress and director, bringing added prestige to the production.

The story revolves around Regina (played by Youlim Nam), a woman in her 30s, who drunkenly shares her birthday struggles with a yellow cab driver (played by Hari Bhaskar). Exploring themes of loneliness, relationships, and self-reflection, the play offers a heartfelt and comedic take on navigating life's challenges.

Youlim Nam is an accomplished playwright and performer, having written and acted in several works, including "A Connected Place," which was staged Off-Broadway last year.

She is a member of the Dramatists Guild and incorporates postmodernist techniques like Six Viewpoints to explore innovative and experimental forms of theater.
